Enabling everyone to reach their full potential	Reading: Differentiated reading tasks ensure all learners engage with texts that challenge and support them, helping every child grow in confidence and fluency. Writing: Pupils are encouraged to express themselves creatively and accurately, building stamina and pride in their written work over time. Oracy: Class discussions and collaborative learning are tailored to include all voices, so learners develop stronger interpersonal and communication skills.			
Developing a love for learning and a desire to achieve	Reading: Curated reading corners, engaging book choices, and carefully selected books for whole class reading, foster curiosity, turning reading from a task into a pleasure. Writing: Inspiring writing tasks and writing for a purpose and audience motivate children to write with intent and enthusiasm. Oracy: Celebrating oral storytelling, presentations, and drama activities helps learners see communication as exciting and meaningful.			
Encouraging everyone to become independent and confident, with a belief in themselves	Reading: Pupils take ownership of their reading choices through book reviews or book sharing building autonomy and confidence. Writing: Editing their own work and reflecting on feedback cultivates resilience and a growth mindset. Oracy: Structured opportunities for debate or group sharing help pupils voice their ideas clearly and respectfully.			
Promoting Christian Values and respecting diversity	Reading: Exposure to diverse authors and characters builds empathy and broadens cultural understanding. Writing: Personal reflection and values-based writing offer chances to explore moral themes and identity. Oracy: Celebrating different viewpoints through inclusive dialogue teaches respect, compassion, and active listening.
